PROGRAMS



LIBERTY MENTORSHIP HUB

LCA's Liberty Mentorship Hub is a growing global community that connects young and budding professionals (mentees) with experienced professionals who serve as their mentors. The program operates with a focus on personalized career guidance and goal-oriented mentor-mentee relationships. During the five month duration per cohort, mentees work with their mentors to set and achieve clear career goals. Since inception, our expanding community of mentors and mentees spans seven countries and over 30 cities.

We began the year with an in-person close-out meeting for the outgoing Cohort (6) of the program. The event provided an opportunity for the mentees to network with one another and also learn from two C-suite executives: Mr. Franklin Ali, Group Chief Human Resources Officer, Interswitch, and Mrs. Adeidunnu Uba, Executive Consultant, Simply Un4gettable.

On May 4, 2024, we onboarded 25 new mentees into Cohort 7 of the program, bringing the total to 187 mentees since the program's inception in 2020. As is the practice, Cohort 7 mentees also got the opportunity to participate in three exclusive learning and networking sessions, during which a variety of career advancement topics were covered.

The mentees had the opportunity to set career goals at the commencement of the program and 74 percent reported achieving more than half of the goals set.

We hosted the annual Mentors Huddle which provided an opportunity for the mentors to learn from one another, share best practices and align expectations before the new cohort commenced.

In 2025, our goal is to onboard two new program cohorts, with the first starting in March. Additionally, we intend to strengthen our ever-growing LMH Alumni community.

A JOURNEY OF GROWTH

- My LCA Mentorship Story

I came across LCA sometime in March 2024 on LinkedIn when they were advertising the 2024 LCA Scholarship Summit.

At the time, I deeply desired to land a full-ride undergraduate scholarship to study Agricultural Science in the United States. However, I honestly didn't know how it would happen, as I had the entrenched belief that it's nearly impossible to secure a full-ride undergraduate scholarship abroad.

During the summit, I heard many success stories that fueled my dream, giving me a sense of possibility that what I was aspiring to achieve was attainable. The summit was so inspiring that I shared the videos with some of my peers (one of whom later enrolled in the mentorship program). In fact, the summit gave me a head start on everything I know about scholarships.

When the application for the next LCA mentorship program for Cohort 7 was announced, I immediately applied. One thing that piqued my interest was the short logical quiz I had to answer during the application process. Applicants were expected to score nothing less than 100%. I spent a considerable amount of time retaking the quiz—up to six times—before I finally scored 100%. That gave me the sense that I was in for something serious, something that would earn me nothing less than 100% excellent results.



I was admitted and matched with Mr. Ikhidero Patrick. My major goal was to land a full-ride undergraduate scholarship. Mr. Patrick gave me valuable insights on how to position myself and identify the opportunities I needed to achieve my goal. Following his guidelines, I began positioning myself correctly on LinkedIn.

Because I am deeply passionate about agriculture, I had the opportunity to connect with officials from the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO). One such official, upon seeing my passion for agriculture, interviewed me via Zoom to learn more about me and my aspirations. Although FAO didn't have any support available for undergraduate scholarship funding, she encouraged me to keep fighting for my dream and pledged to support me in any way possible going forward.

I ensured that I updated my LCA mentor about everything going on in my life related to my mentorship goal. Sometimes, when I couldn't wait until our second-Saturday monthly check-in calls, I sent an email, and he always responded with fresh perspectives and insights despite his busy schedule.

Committing to the Liberty Career Academy (LCA) Mentorship Hub was one of the best decisions I ever made. This months-long productivity exercise equipped me with the tools necessary for the results I desired.

From the very beginning, it was made clear that taking ownership of my goals and being proactive were essential to maximizing the benefits of this program. Attending the monthly huddles became a highlight for me; I filled my notes with insights that I now frequently refer back to. The support from the staff was equally remarkable. Mrs. Glory Samuel-Adebajo, who moderated our meetings, and the rest of the team created an environment where LCA felt less like work and more like a community.

Overall, I am incredibly grateful for the opportunity to connect with amazing individuals who share my focus on goals and self-development. The LCA Mentorship Hub has not only provided me with guidance but has also empowered me to pursue my aspirations with confidence and clarity.

CAREER & STEWARDSHIP (CAS) BOOTCAMP

The Career and Stewardship (CAS) Bootcamp is designed to inspire and equip young people aged 13 to 20 with practical life skills and guidance for their career and stewardship journeys.

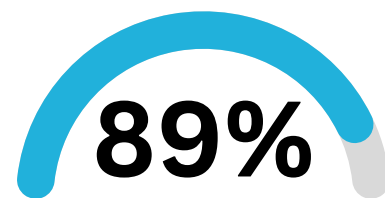
At the 2024 edition (the eighth in the series), in-person attendance rose to 101 participants, a notable increase from last year's 73. This growth highlights the program's growing popularity and relevance among young people.

The two-day event brought together diverse speakers and participants for an impactful experience. Eight seasoned speakers covered topics such as Technology, Financial Intelligence, Life Planning, and Handling Setbacks. Feedback from participants showed that this mix of speakers was particularly effective, offering both relatability and diversity of experience.

Over the course of the event, participants engaged in interactive sessions, workshops, and games, action-learning-centered activities—all provided at no cost to the participants.

An impressive 81% of participants rated their experience as "very good" or "excellent," reflecting high satisfaction with the event's content, organization, and delivery. This positive feedback underscores the success of the event and its ability to meet the needs of its target audience.

The 2024 Career & Stewardship Bootcamp was a resounding success, marked by increased participation, effective programming, and positive feedback. With continued improvements and strategic planning, we are confident that future editions will have an even greater impact on the lives of young people.

While the event initially focused on Nigeria, recent years have seen growing interest from other countries across Africa, North America, and Asia. In 2024, the Summit had program participants from Ghana, Rwanda, Uganda, China, Canada, Ethiopia, Nigeria, Sierra Leone, and Kenya, reflecting its expanding impact.

The 2024 edition of the conference achieved a remarkable 15.9% growth in attendance, welcoming 175 participants, compared to 151 in the previous year. This marked a major milestone in the Summit's efforts to broaden its reach and influence.

The 2024 edition also featured a stellar lineup of guest speakers and scholars from Harvard University, Makerere University Uganda, City University of London, Scholarship IQ and Intel Corporation. A full-circle moment was the session of one of the invited speakers, Samson Folarin, who had attended the program a couple of years back, applied the lessons shared and bagged a Chevening Scholarship afterwards.

The diverse perspectives and expertise of the speakers enriched the discussions, offering practical solutions to education funding challenges.

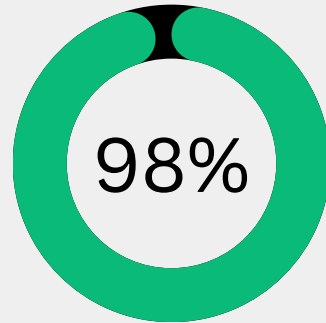

As we look forward to the Scholarship Summit 2025, our vision is to build on past successes while expanding the reach to students in more countries.

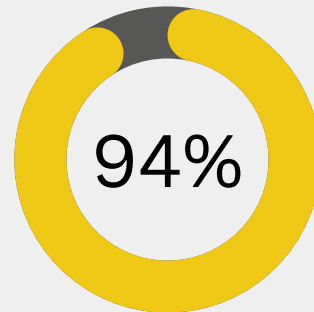

At one point, I received a rejection letter that broke me and nearly crushed my spirit. I turned to Mr. Patrick, and he spent time encouraging me to make peace with the fact that failure is part of the process. That conversation felt like a moment of recharge for me.

I resumed my pursuit of my goals with renewed determination. This time, I connected on LinkedIn with a retired admissions officer in the American university system. At that time, he was looking for young people to coach through the U.S. admissions process for free. Before retiring in November 2023, he had worked as an undergraduate and graduate school admissions officer for 51 years at various public and private U.S. universities.

I reached out, introduced myself, and offered to assist him in his goal (a lesson I learned from my LCA mentor). He reviewed my LinkedIn profile, and we began communicating both on LinkedIn and via Zoom calls.

At one point, he took my CV and LinkedIn profile and wrote to 51 land-grant universities on my behalf, requesting undergraduate international scholarships for me. A few schools responded with varied feedback.

In all these efforts, he offered to write me a recommendation letter for whichever school I applied to, despite knowing me for less than a year.

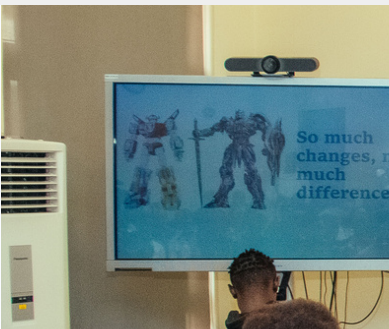
Although I have not yet reached a conclusive end in this phase, I am convinced that God can send help through unusual means, and LCA is among the help God sent my way.

For me, this is a clear miracle and an answer to my prayer—going from not knowing anything about international scholarships to now having someone advocating for me in university admission offices where I have not stepped foot into.

The application of the lessons I learned about leadership, communication, and personal development during the monthly sessions with Mr. Gbenga Rufai has been instrumental in my progress so far. Notably, my communication skills have significantly improved.

I want to appreciate Liberty Career Academy for granting me this opportunity of a lifetime—for the gift of a mentor who fits my needs, access to a community of other young minds doing incredible things, and access to mentors doing the things I aspire to achieve. I am truly grateful.

As I reflect on my transformative journey with Liberty Career Academy, I am filled with gratitude and a sense of purpose. I pledge to amplify the works of Liberty Career Academy so that other young people like me, who feel their audacious dreams are out of reach, can also receive the inspiration needed to keep their dreams alive.



BASIC CAREER DISCOVERY COURSE

An important influence in the extent of career success an individual enjoys is the level of clarity and quality of the informed decisions they make as adolescents in high school. Our Basic Career Discovery Course (program) empowers high school and university students with knowledge and skills through specialized career-based training provided at their educational institutions and local community groups.

After a few years of not deploying the program, we re-activated it during the year with an outreach to a couple of schools in the Shomolu area of Lagos state (Golden Anchor High School and Wisdomike College).

Supported by our volunteer team, our lead facilitator, Mr Gbolahan Oladimeji, covered modules on **Navigating Your Path: Fundamentals of Self & Career Discovery, Mentorship, and Skill Acquisition**. In total, 373 students from both schools participated bringing our total reach for this program to 1,173.

The feedback from the school principals and staff who attended the sessions was not only positive but also indicates the growing need for this **“Catch Them Young” (CTY)** approach in career development. For the coming year, our plan is to partner with more (public and private) institutions at the secondary and post-secondary levels, to deliver this program.



LCA SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

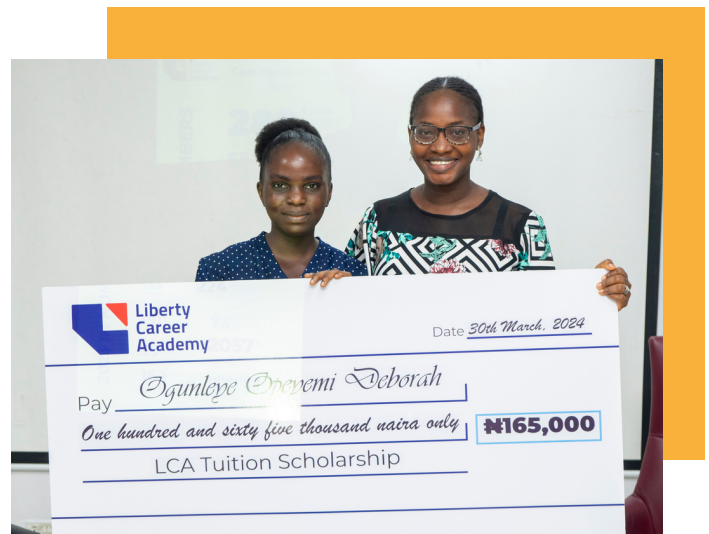
After a couple of years of planning and envisioning, we ran a pilot launch of our Scholarship Program in February 2024 by awarding a scholarship to Ms. Opeyemi Ogunleye, one of our mentees in the Liberty Mentorship Hub program. Opeyemi had been offered admission to study Microbiology at the Federal University of Technology Akure, Ondo State, Nigeria but required financial support to actualize her dream.

With the lessons from this pilot and after months of planning, we announced the public call for applications for the 2024-25 cohort in October 2024. This time around, the scholarship was opened to three categories, namely: the Adeola Okungbaye Award (₦200,000 each), the Merit-Based Scholarship (₦150,000 each), and the Gifted Hands Award (₦100,000 each).

By the close of the application period, we received tremendous interest, with 4,469 applications received from 2,711 unique applicants, demonstrating the growing awareness of and demand for this impactful initiative. Out of these, 2,562 applicants met the eligibility criteria, advancing them to subsequent stages, while 373 have moved further into the next stage of the highly competitive selection process. As the selection process advances,

the program is focused on ensuring a fair and thorough evaluation of each candidate. Applicants who successfully progress through the final stages will be notified before the end of February 2025, with scholarships disbursed to their institutions of learning afterwards.

The finalists will also get an opportunity to gain direct enrolment into our mentorship program to ensure continuous guidance and career support.

LCA SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Building on the success of the 2024-25 cycle, the LCA Scholarship Program is committed to expanding its reach and impact in 2025. A new application cycle will open in October, aiming to attract a wider pool of candidates from across Nigeria.

The program will expand its promotion campaigns, collaborate with post-secondary institutions, and LCA alumni, which will help diversify the applicant pool, ensuring increased participation from underrepresented regions and fields of study.

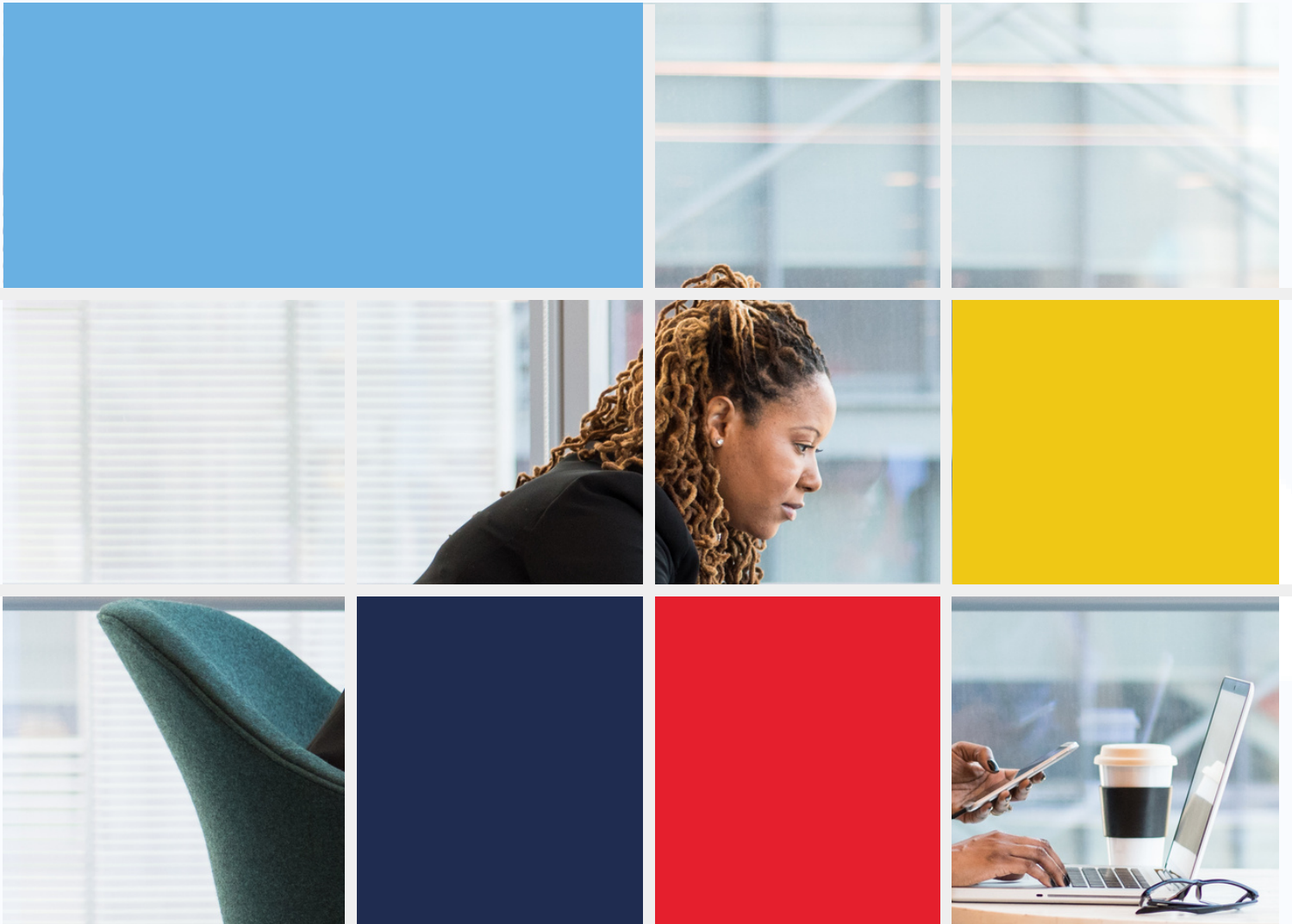

VOLUNTEERS

One of our most prized assets at LCA remains the men and women who volunteer their time and resources to drive the mission of the organization. During the year, LCA recorded a 24% increase in our volunteer and staff numbers compared to the preceding year, indicating our increasing reach and that our mission resonates with more people.

We were privileged to have 13 new active volunteers, bringing the total number of volunteers and staff to 72, located in five different countries and across three continents (Africa, Europe, and North America). Our deepest gratitude goes to every one of the team members who bring their skills and talents to bear on our different programs and operations.

FINANCE

Revenue is the lifeblood of any organization, and for LCA, it powers our mission to empower individuals to discover their unique abilities, equip them with essential skills, and guide them in applying these talents to their careers and businesses. As we expand our reach and influence, our financial needs grow to match our ambition.

In the fiscal year 2024, we achieved a remarkable 58% growth in total revenue, increasing to NGN 6,193,265 from NGN 3,905,599.9 in 2023. This financial growth reflects the growing support for our mission. Donations from private individuals accounted for 49.6% of our revenue, while 44.8% came from internal sources. These contributions allow us to design and implement programs that help young Africans succeed in their academics and pursue meaningful careers.

Our spending in 2024 directly supported our mission, with 76% (NGN 4,513,103) of expenses dedicated to delivering impactful programs that empower people to excel in their careers and businesses. The remaining 24% went to administrative and operational costs, ensuring our organization runs efficiently. Thanks to these efforts, we closed the year with a surplus of approximately NGN 263,000, positioning us to start the next fiscal year on a positive.

This success would not have been possible without the unwavering support of our donors—both private and corporate. Your generosity is the cornerstone of our ability to nurture high-achievers and solution-seekers. We deeply appreciate your commitment to advancing our mission and making a lasting difference in the lives of many.
